




The Tiny





Mini and Hardly and the Big Adventure CATHERINE RAYNER (MACMILLAN) HB \$29.99




SAMANTHA-ELLEN BOUND (AFFIRM) PB \$19.99

Julia and the Shark KIRAN MILLWOOD HARGRAVE (ORION CHILDREN'S BOOKS) HB \$24.99


Julia has followed her mum and dad to live on a remote island ▶


Fireborn: Twelve and the Frozen Forest AISLING FOWLER (HARPER COLLINS) PB \$19.99


Dragon Skin KAREN FOXLEE (ALLEN & UNWIN) HB \$22.99

Exit Through the Gift Shop MARYAM MASTER (PAN AUSTRALIA) PB \$19.99


