Have You Seen Dinosaur? DAVID BARROW (GECKO PRESS) HB \$29.99



Rose Meets Mr Wintergarten BOB GRAHAM (WALKER BOOKS LTD) PB \$18.99




Begin Again OLIVER JEFFERS (HARPER COLLINS UK) HB \$32.99 OUT IN NOV


The Sporty Looky Book DONOVAN BIXLEY (HACHETTE AOTEAROA) HB NZ TITLE \$27.99




Bonkers About Beetles OWEN DAVEY (FLYING EYE BOOKS (WALKER)) PB \$24.99




The Observologist: A handbook for mounting very small scientific expeditions GISELLE CLARKSON (GECKO PRESS) HB NZ TITLE \$39.99
